

Radio Frequency Identity Card (RFID) has already been introduced to track the movement of pilgrims at Mata Vaishno Devi. Sri Mata Vaisandevi Shrine Board (SMVDSB) has started the much-desired skywalk project. This arrangement has been adopted to separate the entry and exit of passengers in the building area.
